A Scavenger Hunt

<u>Goal</u>: Students will gain a better understanding of non-verbal communication and the abilities communication as a whole opens up for them.

Objectives:

- 1. Groups of two or three students will create a series of **6 clues** which will lead another group in class to the end of their scavenger hunt. The group must work together, and create clues that are **specific** and **descriptive**.
- 2. Groups must then exchange their first clue with another group. The other group will have to use their **verbal**, **non-verbal**, **and feedback techniques** learned in class to solve the hunt.
- 3. After participating in the scavenger hunt all students will have to answer one of the three questions found on the other side of this sheet.
- 4. This will in class exercise and written assignment will count for a **project** grade.
